**Background:** The Board of Regents Support Fund is funded through the interest earnings from a Trust Fund dedicated in the Louisiana State Constitution. Each year, funds are allocated to endow program chairs, professorships and scholarships. Colleges are responsible for contributing private funds that matched with public funds according to Board of Regents policies. One of the policy requirements is approval of the endowments by the respective management board prior to submission to the Board of Regents.

**History of Prior Actions:** There is a history of approving the establishment of endowments at LCTCS colleges to comply with Board of Regents match requirements.

**Fiscal Impact:** These four endowments are the result of \$435,000 private donations. If the matches are approved by the Board of Regents, these endowments will secure an additional \$380,000 in state funding, for a total increase in net assets of \$815,000.

**Benefits to System:** This will help our colleges takes steps towards reaching the \$50 million asset goal laid out by Our Louisiana 2020.

On behalf of Delgado Community College, I would like to formally announce our intention to apply for Board of Regents Support Fund (BoRSF) match dollars through the Two-Year Workforce Endowed Scholarship Program, Endowed Undergraduate Scholarship Program for First-Generation Students, and the Endowed Professorships Program.

By way of this correspondence, we ask the LCTCS Board of Supervisors to approve the establishment of the following endowed scholarships:

- **Leona Kruebbe Hilbert and Dr. Gerard Hilbert Charity Alumni Scholarship**
  - This endowment is made possible by a generous award of \$10,000 from Charity Hospital School of Nursing Alumni Association, Inc., to be matched by \$10,000 in state dollars from the Louisiana Board of Regents.
- **Hugh and Maria Garcia Roach Charity Alumni Scholarship**
  - This endowment is made possible by a generous award of \$15,000 from Charity Hospital School of Nursing Alumni Association, Inc., to be matched by \$10,000 in state dollars from the Louisiana Board of Regents.
- **Chancellor's Two-Year Student Workforce Scholarship in STEM Transfer**
  - This endowment is made possible by \$30,000 in contributions from a variety of contributors to the 2016 Delgado Community College Chancellor's Breakfast, to be matched by \$30,000 in state dollars from the Louisiana Board of Regents.
- **Delgado Alumni Association First-Generation Student Scholarship II**
  - This endowment is made possible by a generous award of \$30,000 from Delgado Community College Alumni Association, Inc., to be matched by \$20,000 in state dollars from the Louisiana Board of Regents.
- **Endowed Professorship in Advanced Manufacturing**
  - This endowment is made possible by a generous award of \$60,000 from Delgado Community College Foundation, Inc. to be matched by \$40,000 in state dollars from the Louisiana Board of Regents.


These applications represent \$145,000 in private contributions and \$110,000 in matching funds from the Louisiana Board of Regents.

The BoRSF Two-Year Workforce Endowed Scholarship subprogram allows each two-year college to apply for a one-to-one match in Nursing & Allied Health or STEM Transfer, beginning with a minimum non-state contribution of \$10,000. The BoRSF Endowed Undergraduate Scholarship Program for First-Generation Students provides BoRSF matching funds to establish endowed scholarship funds in support of first-generation college students. Each two-year institution is guaranteed one \$20,000 endowed scholarship fund challenge grant annually to match a private/institutional contribution of \$30,000. The BoRSF Endowed Professorships Program is a non-competitive subprogram designed to help campuses recruit or retain faculty whose research, teaching, and/or public service uniquely contribute to the mission of their departments and institutions. Participation requires a contribution of at least \$60,000 from an external source, to be matched with \$40,000 from the BoRSF.

The establishment of these endowed scholarships allows Delgado Community College to provide opportunities to increase college access and success for students.

At the onset of Bossier Parish Community College's Capital Campaign, Mr. Michael Woods issued a challenge pledge of \$150,000 to establish the Michael H. Woods Family First Generation Endowment. The pledge was to be payable in five installments of \$30,000 each and included a challenge that each \$30,000 installment be submitted for a \$20,000 match from the Board of Regents. Four previous installments have been made. The receipt of a fifth installment fulfills the donor's pledge to the College.

Bossier Parish Community College, having secured \$30,000 from a very generous donation by Mr. Michael Woods, requests approval to establish the fifth **Michael H. Woods Family First Generation Endowment**. If approved by the Board of Regents, the donation from Michael Woods will match \$20,000 in support from Board of Regents Sponsored Programs to fully endow the fund. Interest earnings from the endowment will be awarded to students at the discretion of Bossier Parish Community College.

The BoRSF Endowed Undergraduate Scholarship Program, founded in 2007, is a non-competitive program, providing BoRSF matching funds to establish endowed scholarship funds in support of first-generation college students. Each four-year institution is guaranteed one \$40,000 endowed scholarship fund challenge grant annually to match a private or institutional contribution of \$60,000. Each two-year college is guaranteed one \$20,000 endowed scholarship fund challenge grant annually to match a private or institutional contribution of \$30,000. Proceeds will be used to establish or enhance permanent endowed scholarship funds.

**Benefits to the System:** The establishment of this endowed scholarship allows Bossier Parish Community College to provide opportunities that increase college access and success for first generation students.
