- 3. Associate of General Studies (AGS) 100% online (CIP 240102) Transfer Option

Program Terminations

- 1. Associate of Science (AS) in Energy and Chemical Process Technology (CIP 15.0503) - 3 STARS
 - a. Technical Diploma (TD) in Alternative Energy and Chemical Process Technician (CIP 15.0503)
 - b. Certificate of Technical Studies (CTS) in Alternative Energy and Chemical Process Technician (CIP 15.0503)
 - c. Technical Competency Area (TCA) in Alternative Energy and Chemical Process Technician (CIP 15.0503)

Background: SLCC offers a number of classes in both online and hybrid delivery systems. As their popularity grow, it is clear there is a demand for non-traditional offerings. SLCC is requesting to revise the AS in Business and in Criminal Justice to be delivered entirely online. The AS in Business will be marketed to students who want to earn a college degree without leaving home or neglecting familial duties while the target population for the AS in Criminal Justice is active law enforcement though any interested student may enter the program.

Currently, the AGS is offered as a hybrid program. The logical next step is to offer it fully online allowing students working on other programs to complete the AGS along the way. This modification will expand elective choices thereby providing students maximum flexibility to transfer courses in and out of SLCC.

SLCC is requesting to terminate the Technical Diploma (TD), including the CTS and TCA, and the AS in Energy and Chemical Process Technology. Due to low enrollment, the program has gone through the proper teach-out process with no students presently enrolled.

Fiscal Impact: There is a shared cost to delivering these programs 100% online that includes the hiring of additional staff, training opportunities, and purchasing software to implement the online programs. Cost savings for the terminated programs will be realized over time.

History of Prior Actions: There is a history of offering programs via distance education to meet student and workforce needs as well as a history of terminating programs to better align with student needs and industry demand.

Benefits to the System: The modifications will allow SLCC to offer flexible scheduling options to adult learners and tap into a new market by advertising degrees that are offered fully online. The termination will allow SLCC to realize cost savings from a low enrollment program and better meet student and workforce needs in other areas.

Describe Proce Attaining & Estimating Enrollment:	Currently, the ASB program has 400 students. Many of these students are taking traditional and online classes to build their course schedule. The ASB Department Chair and Dean support the online degree and worked to insure the curriculum mirrors the traditional one. The Dean suggested a basic pathway for the online program. The plan is to contact declared ASB majors to determine their interest in completing their degree online. Additionally, the Louisiana Online interest form has generated student emails to the Distance Education Officer. The marketing plan is to advertise a new option to earn a college degree without leaving one's home or neglecting familial duties. In order to promote this program and student success, a faculty member will be assigned as the ASB Program Advisor and work with all students who are in the online program.

The program requires students to complete 6 hours of ENGL, 3 hours of Social Science, 6 hours of Science, 3 hours of Humanities, 6 hours of Math, and 3 hours of Fine Arts for 27 hours. They are also required to complete 21 hours in their core Economics, Accounting, Business and Computer courses with 12 hours additional hours for Electives to total 60 hours.

- 7. Describe distance learning technologies which will be used to offer the proposed program. The courses will be taught using the LMS platform Canvas. Supplemental assistance via Grammarly, Respondus, and Library Databases.
