SUBJECT: Board of Regents Matched Endowed Scholarships and Professorship

FOR BOARD ACTION:

Recommendation: Staff recommends that the Board approve the endowed scholarships and professorships at Baton Rouge Community College, six two-year workforce endowed scholarships; Bossier Parish Community College, four two-year workforce endowed scholarships and one endowed professorship; Central Louisiana Technical Community College, one two-year workforce endowed scholarship and one endowed professorship; Delgado Community College, two two-year workforce endowed scholarships; Fletcher Technical Community College, one two-year workforce endowed scholarship; Louisiana Delta Community College, one two-year workforce endowed scholarship; Northshore Technical Community College, eight two-year workforce endowed scholarships; Nunez Community College, three two-year workforce endowed scholarships; South Louisiana Community College, eleven two-year workforce endowed scholarships and one endowed Chair; SOWELA Technical Community College, three two-year workforce endowed scholarships as presented.

Baton Rouge Community College

The Chancellor Willie E. Smith, Sr. Endowed Scholarship I & II

This endowment is made possible with \$40,000 in private funds. BRCC requests \$40,000 in matching dollars to fully endow the fund at \$80,000. This request is made in compliance with the BORSF Professorship Program policy for two-year colleges with a minimum non-state contribution of \$40,000.


\$80,000 total (\$40,000 private: \$40,000 public)

The Chancellor Willie E. Smith Sr. Endowed Scholarship III

This endowment is made possible with \$10,000 in private funds. BRCC requests \$10,000 in matching dollars to fully endow the fund at \$20,000. This request is made in compliance with the BORSF Professorship Program policy for two-year colleges with a minimum non-state contribution of \$10,000.

This endowment is made possible with \$20,000 in private funds. BRCC requests \$20,000 in matching dollars to fully endow the fund at \$40,000. This request is made in compliance with the BORSF Professorship Program policy for two-year colleges with a minimum non-state contribution of \$20,000.

\$40,000 total (\$20,000 private: \$20,000 public)

Healthy Blue Endowed Scholarship

This endowment is made possible with \$25,000 in private funds. BRCC requests \$20,000 in matching dollars to fully endow the fund at \$45,000. This request is made in compliance with the BORSF Professorship Program policy for two-year colleges with a minimum non-state contribution of \$20,000.

\$45,000 total (\$25,000 private: \$20,000 public)

The Credit Farm Bureau Endowed Scholarship

This endowment is made possible with \$20,000 in private funds. BRCC requests \$20,000 in matching dollars to fully endow the fund at \$40,000. This request is made in compliance with the BORSF Professorship Program policy for two-year colleges with a minimum non-state contribution of \$20,000.

Sammie and Shirley Cospers Endowed Scholarship in Sciences

This endowment is made possible with \$40,000 in private funds. BRCC requests \$40,000 in matching dollars to fully endow the fund at \$80,000. This request is made in compliance with the BORSF Professorship Program policy for two-year colleges with a minimum non-state contribution of \$40,000.

\$80,000 total (\$40,000 private: \$40,000 public)

Bossier Parish Community College

Davis Family Endowed Professorship in Welding

This endowment is made possible with \$60,000 in private funds. BPCC requests \$40,000 in matching dollars to fully endow the fund at \$100,000. This request is made in compliance with the BORSF Professorship Program policy for two-year colleges with a minimum non-state contribution of \$60,000.

\$100,000 total (\$60,000 private: \$40,000 public)

John & Joanna Magale Endowed Workforce Scholarship in Allied Health

This endowment is made possible with \$30,000 in private funds. BPCC requests \$30,000 in matching dollars to increase the principal amount of its existing scholarship from \$100,000 to \$160,000. This request is made in compliance with the BoRSF Two-Year Workforce subprogram's policy for a 1:1 match for two-year colleges in allied health fields with a minimum non-state contribution of \$10,000.

\$60,000 total (\$30,000 private: \$30,000 public)

Citizens National Bank/John R. McConathy Endowed Scholarship in Business

This endowment is made possible with \$40,000 in private funds. BPCC requests \$40,000 in matching dollars to increase the principal amount of its existing scholarship from \$120,000 to \$200,000. This request is made in compliance with the BoRSF Two-Year Workforce subprogram's policy for a 1:1 match for two-year colleges in business, accounting, and finance fields with a minimum non-state contribution of \$20,000.

\$80,000 total (\$40,000 private: \$40,000 public)

Louisiana Healthcare Connections Endowed Scholarship in Allied Health

This endowment is made possible with \$50,000 in private funds. BPCC requests \$50,000 in matching dollars to fully endow the fund at \$100,000. This request is made in compliance with the BoRSF Two-Year Workforce subprogram's policy for a 1:1 match for two-year colleges in nursing and allied health fields with a minimum non-state contribution of \$10,000.

\$100,000 total (\$50,000 private: \$50,000 public)

Louisiana Contractor's Licensing Board Endowed Scholarship in Construction Crafts

This endowment is made possible with \$20,000 in private funds. BPCC requests \$20,000 in matching dollars to fully endow the fund at \$40,000. This request is made in compliance with the BoRSF Two-Year Workforce subprogram's policy for a 1:1 match for two-year colleges in construction fields with a minimum non-state contribution of \$20,000.

\$40,000 total (\$20,000 private: \$20,000 public)

Central Louisiana Technical Community College

Cleco Corporate Holdings LLC Endowed Professorship in Advanced Manufacturing

This endowment is made possible by \$60,000 from Cleco Corporate Holdings LLC, to be matched by \$40,000 in state dollars from the Louisiana Board of Regents. The BoRSF Professorships subprogram allows each two-year college to apply for endowed professorships, beginning with a minimum non-state contribution of \$60,000. This application represents a portion of the overall request up to \$320,000 in private contributions, and \$280,000 in matching funds from the Louisiana Board of Regents.

\$100,000 total (\$60,000 private: \$40,000 public)

Cleco Power of a Promise Workforce Scholarships in Manufacturing Technology (seeking up to 5 scholarship endowments at \$20,000 each).

This endowment is made possible with \$100,000 in non-state funds from Cleco. This application represents a portion of the overall request up to \$100,000 in private Cleco contributions and \$100,000 in matching funds from the Louisiana Board of Regents.

\$200,000 total (\$100,000 private: \$100,000 public)

Delgado Community College

Delgado-Charity Alumni Scholarship in Nursing

This endowment is made possible through a combined \$150,000 in donations to the Charity School of Nursing Alumni Association in honor of several former students. Delgado is submitting a proposal requesting a \$150,000 match to fully endow the scholarship through the subprogram's 1:1 match requirement.

\$300,000 total (\$150,000 private: \$150,000 public)

Healthy Blue Two-Year Workforce Scholarship in Allied Health

This endowment is made possible through a \$30,000 donation from Blue Cross Blue Shield's Healthy Blue initiative to support the college's allied program. Per the subprogram's 1:1 match requirement, this endowment will request a \$30,000 match from the program to become fully endowed.

Fletcher Technical Community College

Construction Education Trust Fund and John Deere Endowed Scholarship in Construction Crafts

This endowment is made possible with \$20,000 private matching funds raised by Fletcher Foundation. Fletcher requested \$20,000 in matching dollars to fully endow the fund at \$40,000. This request is made in compliance with BoRSF subprogram's policy for a 1:1 match for two year colleges with a minimum non-state contribution of \$20,000.

Barbara R. and Rickey L. Jones Endowed Health Science Scholarship

This endowment is made possible with \$20,000 in private funds. LDCC requests \$20,000 in matching dollars to fully endow the fund at \$40,000. This request is made in compliance with the BORSF subprogram program's policy for a 1:1 match for two-year colleges in Allied Health with a minimum non-state contribution of \$10,000.

Jimmy Ryan, IV, Memorial Endowed Scholarship in Electrician

This endowment is made possible with \$20,000 in non-state funds raised by the Northshore College Enhancement Foundation. NTCC requests \$20,000 in matching dollars to fully endow the fund at \$40,000. This request is made in compliance with the Board of Regents Support Fund Two-Year Workforce Scholarship subprogram's policy for a 1:1 match for two-year colleges with a minimum contribution of \$20,000.

CLECO Scholarship in Electric Line Technology

This endowment is made possible with \$20,000 in non-state funds raised by the Northshore College Enhancement Foundation. NTCC requests \$20,000 in matching dollars to fully endow the fund at \$40,000. This request is made in compliance with the Board of Regents Support Fund Two-Year Workforce Scholarship subprogram's policy for a 1:1 match for two-year colleges with a minimum contribution of \$20,000.

This endowment is made possible with \$60,000 non-state funds raised by the Northshore College Enhancement Foundation. NTCC requests \$60,000 in matching dollars to fully endow the fund at \$120,000. This request is made in compliance with the Board of Regents Support Fund Two-Year Workforce Scholarship subprogram's policy for a 1:1 match for two-year colleges with a minimum contribution of \$20,000.

This endowment is made possible with \$100,000 in non-state funds raised by the Northshore College Enhancement Foundation. NTCC requests \$100,000 in matching dollars to fully endow the fund at \$200,000. This request is made in compliance with the Board of Regents Support Fund Two-Year Workforce Scholarship subprogram's policy for a 1:1 match for two-year colleges with a minimum contribution of \$20,000.

\$200,000 total (\$100,000 private: \$100,000 public)

Nunez Community College

Boeing Endowed Two Year Workforce Scholarship in Aerospace Manufacturing Technology

This endowment was made possible by \$25,000 in contributions from Boeing and the Nunez Community College Foundation to be matched by \$20,000 in state dollars from the Louisiana Board of Regents.

\$45,000 total (\$25,000 private: \$20,000 public)

Nunez Community College Construction Craft Endowed Two Year Workforce Scholarship in Electrical Construction

This endowment was made possible by \$20,000 in contributions from The Nunez Community College Foundation to be matched by \$20,000 in state dollars from the Louisiana Board of Regents.

\$40,000 total (\$20,000 private: \$20,000 public)

Mitchell Smith Endowed Two Year Workforce Scholarship in Hospitality

This request is made in compliance with the Louisiana Board of Regents Support Fund Enhancement Program policy for a 1:1 match for two-year colleges in Nursing with a minimum non-state contribution of \$10,000.

This endowment is made possible with \$10,000 private matching funds raised by the SOWELA Foundation. SOWELA requests \$10,000 to be matched in state dollars from the Louisiana Board of Regents. This request is made in compliance with the Louisiana Board of Regents Support Fund Enhancement Program policy for a 1:1 match for two-year colleges in Nursing with a minimum non-state contribution of \$10,000.

\$20,000 total (\$10,000 private: \$10,000 public)

Charles C. Harris Endowed Scholarship – Nursing & Allied Health

This endowment is made possible with \$10,000 private matching funds raised by the SOWELA Foundation. SOWELA requests \$10,000 to be matched in state dollars from the Louisiana Board of Regents. This request is made in compliance with the Louisiana Board of Regents Support Fund Enhancement Program policy for a 1:1 match for two-year colleges in Nursing with a minimum non-state contribution of \$10,000.

\$20,000 total (\$10,000 private: \$10,000 public)

Background: The Board of Regents Support Fund is funded through the interest earnings from a Trust Fund dedicated in the Louisiana State Constitution. Each year, funds are allocated to endow program chairs, professorships, and scholarships. Colleges are responsible for contributing private funds that matched with public funds according to Board of Regents policies. One of the policy requirements is approval of the endowments by the respective management board prior to submission to the Board of Regents.

History of Prior Actions: There is a history of approving the establishment of endowments at LCTCS colleges to comply with Board of Regents match requirements.

Fiscal Impact: The Endowments are the result of **\$2,220,000** in private donations. If the matches are approved by the Board of Regents, these endowments will secure an additional **\$1,920,000** in state funding, for a total increase in net assets of **\$4,020,000**.

Benefits to System: This will help our colleges take steps towards increasing asset goals.

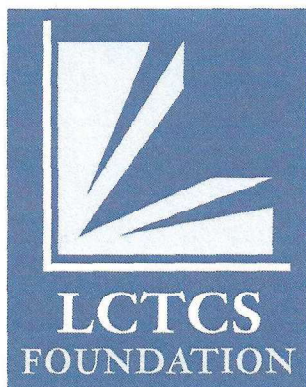

Construction Craft Endowment for Two-Year Workforce Scholarship Agreement

Foundation for Louisiana's Community and Technical Colleges

This will acknowledge that a contribution ("Donation") has been made by **Foundation for Louisiana's Community and Technical Colleges** ("Donor") to the **Baton Rouge Community College Foundation** ("Foundation"), a non-profit, tax-exempt corporation supporting **Baton Rouge Community College** ("College"), to establish a Construction Craft Endowment for Two-Year Workforce Scholarship ("Fund").

This instrument sets forth the rules, regulations, and governing provisions that will apply to the Fund which are consistent with the policies of the College.

I. INITIAL GIFT

The Donors have made an irrevocable gift of \$10,000.00 delivered to the Foundation. This gift is part of *The LCTCS Foundation's contribution from Construction Education Trust Fund (\$10,000)* and *Baton Rouge Community College Foundation (\$10,000)*.

The gift qualified for the state match from the Louisiana Board of Regents Support Fund of \$20,000, for a total endowment of \$40,000 for the purposes prescribed below.

II. NAME AND PURPOSE

The Fund, designated as the **Baton Rouge Community College Construction Craft Endowment for Two-Year Workforce Scholarship**, is hereby created to receive gifts, and be administered according to this agreement.

The purpose of the Fund is to create an endowed scholarship to benefit the students at the College.

III. DISTRIBUTION OF FUNDS

The Foundation, a 501(c)3 organization, will be responsible for the fiscal and foundation reporting requirements.

IV. ADDITIONAL GIFTS

Any person (whether an individual, corporation, trust, estate, or any other organization or entity) may make a gift to the Foundation for the purpose of the Fund by making conveyance or money to the Foundation designation that the assets conveyed shall be added to this Fund. The form of the gift and any conditions associated with the gift must be acceptable to the Foundation. Any assets conveyed in this manner shall be added to the principal of the Fund.

V. INVESTMENT AND SPENDING POLICY

- A. The Fund shall be permanently invested by the Foundation. The tax benefits available to a donor for gifts to the Foundation, which is a 501(c)(3) charitable organization, are determined by the appropriate sections of the Internal Revenue Code.
- B. The Donation is irrevocable, and the Fund will be administered in accordance with the Foundation's investment guidelines and spending policies. The Foundation may combine the Fund with other endowment funds to maximize expected return, improve investment diversification, and provide efficiency in investment management. The undersigned Donors agrees to permit these funds to be merged with other assets of the Foundation for investment purposes provided that the assets are separately identified and accounted for periodically.
- C. The undersigned Donors recognizes and acknowledges that inflation and other factors may reduce the value of the endowment in the future and specifically authorize the Foundation to add a portion of the earnings to the principal or corpus each year so that the principal or corpus may increase.
- D. The Foundation's spending policy on endowments as determined by the Foundation's Board of Directors is to annually distribute for support of college programs, not more than 5%, net of fees, of a three-year rolling average of the endowment's total asset value. The actual amount of awards made from the endowment will be determined based on the endowment's earnings. An important objective of the Foundation's spending policy is to preserve the purchasing power of the Fund.

VI. CONTINGENCY PROVISION

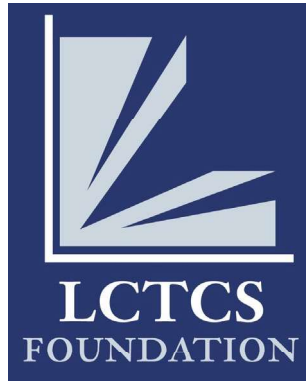

MINUTES

President Rocky Rockett welcomed everyone and thanked all for attending. Rocky Rockett asked for a motion to approve the minutes of the Board of Directors meeting held on June 21, 2023, as presented. On motion by Michael Woods and second by Dr. Markey Pierre, the Board voted unanimously to approve the June 21, 2023 minutes as presented.

Dr. Jennifer Lawrence gave the financial report and presented the financial statements. After discussion, Dr. Markey Pierre made a motion to accept the financial report and financial statements as presented. Dr. Rick Bateman seconded the motion, and all approved.

Dr. Rick Bateman presented the Chancellor’s Report. An enrollment update was given for Fall 2023 and Spring 2024. Dr. Bateman presented a video highlighting recent activities on campus and department/student honors.

Susie Stinson presented the development report. It was reported that the Foundation awarded approximately \$89,000 in scholarships this Fall semester. The Spring 2024 application cycle is now open. It was reported that the Foundation received a new major gift from the Magale Foundation of \$25,000 and a new grant award of \$6,000 from the Gene Haas Foundation. Directors were given annual endowment reports for those endowed funds established by the BPCF Foundation in satisfaction of the Board of Regents reporting requirements. The FY22-23 audit and agreed-upon procedures report are almost completed. Additional items will be voted on in New Business.

Coach Amanda Nordberg gave a brief report on Athletics. It was reported that several student athletes were awarded Foundation scholarships this semester. The turf project for the Cavalier baseball field is almost completed.

The following were items discussed in New Business.

On behalf of the Department of Institutional Advancement, Susie Stinson recommended the Board allocate \$10,000 from the Endowment Management Fee to the Rusty Moss Memorial Scholarship which would create the first endowed scholarship for the BPCF Natchitoches campus. It was reported that the Moss family has raised \$10,000 in private funds. After discussion, Hardy Foreman made a motion to allocate \$10,000 from the Endowment Management Fee to the Rusty Moss Memorial Scholarship. Dr. Markey Pierre seconded the motion, and all approved.

On behalf of the Department of Institutional Advancement, Susie Stinson recommended the Board allocate \$5,000 from the Endowment Management Fee to the John & Joanna Magale Endowed Scholarship in Allied Health to add to the recent \$25,000 private gift from the Magale Foundation.
