IV. APPROVAL OF MEETING AGENDA FOR FEBRUARY 13, 2019

On motion by Supervisor Potts, seconded by Supervisor St. Blanc, the Board voted to approve the February 13, 2019, meeting agenda as presented. The motion carried.

V. APPROVAL OF MEETING MINUTES FROM DECEMBER 12, 2018

On motion by Supervisor Carter, seconded by Supervisor St. Blanc, the Board voted to approve the meeting minutes of December 12, 2018 as presented. The motion carried.

VI. REPORTS

A. Chair of the Board Report

Chair Price provided the following report:

- ❖ The LAVetCorps Campus Veteran Center Rollout was announced early today at 9:00 am. Governor Edwards made the announcement and MOUs were signed by the Department of Veterans Affairs and each Higher Ed System. There will be 30 centers on college campuses around the state that will aid veteran students.
- ❖ Invited SOWELA Chancellor, Dr. Neil Aspinwall, SOWELA Workforce Development Director, David Hayes, and Alex Stroman, from TransCanada, to the table to discuss the partnership between SOWELA and TransCanada which they will present for approval in Board Item VIII, B, 2. They highlighted the partnership between SOWELA and TransCanada. TransCanada is committed to safely, responsibly, and reliably transporting energy across the continent, and is additionally committed to be a good neighbor in the communities where they live, work, and operate. TransCanada is thrilled to partner with SOWELA to provide resources in creating a workforce training program.

On a matter of Chair's privilege, Dr. Sullivan presented Item VIII. B. 2 to the Board:

Naming Rights Opportunity for SOWELA Pipeline Training Program

On motion by Supervisor Smith, seconded by Supervisor Bradford, the Board voted to authorize SOWELA Technical Community College to name the new Pipeline Training Program, the TransCanada Pipeline Training Academy (and factoring any legal name changes that may occur in future years), in honor of a \$1 million donation by TransCanada to help with the expenses associated with the creation and startup of the program. The motion carried.

Supervisor Toups arrived after the vote of this item.

❖ Invited Delgado Interim Chancellor, Dr. William Wainwright, DCC Vice Chancellor of Workforce Development and Institutional Advancement, Arlanda Williams and DCC Executive Director of the Maritime Center and Interim Executive Director of the Advanced Manufacturing Center, Rick Schwab to discuss DCC's Brown Water Deckhand Training Class & Progress of River City. The River City Campus continues to provide important workforce training programs to the area. Dr. Williams noted that the semester began with 191 students in the academic division and have seen more than 100 students already in the workforce division. Dr. Schwab thanked the Board for their continued support of Delgado.

❖ Invited Chris Broadwater, Trish Felder, Donald Songy & Lisa Vosper to discuss the Perkins V State Plan which is Board Item VIII, B, 4. Mr. Broadwater highlighted the Carl D. Perkins Act funds that flow through our system and state high schools that fund programs to spur interest in career and technical education. LCTCS administers the funds for the State of Louisiana. Because of changes in the federal fund distribution, LCTCS had led the statewide effort to create a revised plan for Louisiana's Perkins funding.

Dr. Vosper with the Louisiana Board of Regents complemented the leadership of Ms. Felder and Mr. Broadwater for being so inclusive of and collaborating with all parties that benefit from the Perkins funding.

Mr. Songy, Director of Education Policy for Governor John Bel Edwards noted that the process to update this plan has created opportunities to work better between agencies.

Mr. Broadwater noted that the Board will not meet again before the plan will be presented to the Governor and asks that the Board give Dr. Sullivan the authorization to approve the Perkins V Transition State Plan when it is in a final form for presentation to the Governor.

On a matter of Chair's privilege, Dr. Sullivan presented Item VIII. B. 4 to the Board:

Strengthening Career and Technical Education for the 21st Century Act (Perkins V) Transition State Plan Approval

On motion by Supervisor McConduit, seconded by Supervisor Yantis, the Board voted to authorize LCTCS President, Dr. Monty Sullivan, to review and approve the Perkins V Transition State Plan upon its completion on or before March 15, 2019. The motion carried.

 - B. President's Report

Dr. Sullivan provided the following report:

- Announced that Bossier Parish Community College and South Louisiana Community College were both nominated for the Bellwether Award. This is a great achievement for both institutions.
- Recognized Dr. Natalie Harder for her recent appointment to the Federal Reserve Human Capital Board. It is a three-year term and she will represent all of higher education in Louisiana.
- ❖ Invited Supervisor Raissa Yantis to share her experience on the recent COSBP (Council of Student Body Presidents) legislative visit in Washington, DC.

Ms. Yantis thanked Dr. Amber Blair for accompanying the group in the Capitol city. She noted that the student leaders visited DC January 30 – February 3, 2019 and visited many members of the Louisiana Federal Congressional Delegation. Additionally, they were able to visit the US Department of Higher Education.

Dr. Sullivan presented the Board Development Item on the Agenda.

Dr. Sullivan noted that beginning with this meeting, the staff will present board development sessions during each meeting in an effort to better equip the Board with knowledge of the work that is being done across the system.

2. Facility Use Agreement between the St. Charles Parish United Way and the LCTCS for the Benefit of River Parishes Community College

On motion by Supervisor Toups, seconded by Supervisor Bradford, the Board voted to authorize the President and the Chancellor of River Parishes Community College to negotiate and execute all documents necessary to facilitate a Facility Use Agreement with the St. Charles Parish United Way to provide training and instruction in St. Rose at 140 James Drive East. The motion carried.

3. Acceptance of Property Donation for the Benefit of Delgado Community College West Bank Campus

On motion by Supervisor McConduit, seconded by Supervisor Toups, the Board voted to accept the donation of property located at 2440 Constellation Street, Algiers from the Algiers Development District through the Delgado Community College Foundation, for the benefit of Delgado Community College West Bank Campus. The proposed land donation is a part of the former Naval Reserve Facility currently known as "Federal City". The motion carried.

Supervisor Bradford presented the Finance Action items for consideration by the Board.

 - 1. Resolution for Fletcher Technical Community College to partner with Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government on Grant Opportunity

On motion by Supervisor Smith, seconded by Supervisor Salathe, the Board voted to approve the attached resolution for the receipt and expenditure of grant funds between Fletcher Technical Community College and Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government. The motion carried.

2. Naming Rights Opportunity for SOWELA Pipeline Training Program

3. Student Referendum for Fletcher Technical Community College

Fletcher Technical Community College Chancellor Kristine Strickland introduced the FTCC SGA Vice President and Phi Theta Kappa President to the Board. They each took the opportunity to thank the Board and inform them of the reason for the increase to the Student Activity Fee from \$5 to \$15 per semester. They articulated that the increase in this fee will aid in strengthening the relationship between students and FTCC, allowing for the college to better support students and student activities while enrolled and create a feeling of loyalty to FTCC post completion.

On motion by Supervisor Smith, seconded by Supervisor McConduit, the Board voted to authorize the Student Government Association of Fletcher Technical Community College (FTCC) to conduct a referendum to assess a \$15.00 per student activity fee each semester, beginning in the 2019 fall term. The motion carried.

4. Strengthening Career and Technical Education for the 21st Century Act (Perkins V) Transition State Plan Approval

Supervisor St. Blanc presented the Personnel Action items for consideration by the Board.
