**Background:** Louisiana Delta Community College is requesting to add a Career and Technical Certificate (CTC) in Emergency Medical Technician in place of the Technical Competency Area (TCA) per Board of Regents Academic Affairs Policy 2.15.

**Fiscal Impact:** The administrative structure and additional resources will not change from what was previously established in the TCA Emergency Medical Technician program.
