1. Certificate of Technical Studies (CTS) in Pharmacy Technician (CIP 51.0805) - 4 STARS

Background: Louisiana Delta Community College (LDCC) is seeking approval to adopt the Pharmacy Technician program from Bossier Parish Community College (BPCC). Recent revisions to LCTCS Policy #1.024 updated the process that colleges use to create, modify, or adopt curriculum making it more efficient and streamlined. Staff is requesting that the BPCC program be adopted by LDCC. LDCC is responding to the high demand for pharmacy technicians who work alongside pharmacists.

**Fiscal Impact:** A grant for \$150,000 is secured for start-up costs. Support for this program will fall under the responsibility of the health science program director and department head along with the campus director. No additional support services will be required.

**History of Prior Actions:** There is a history of revising and creating new programs to meet student and workforce needs.

The teacher's edition books were mailed to us complimentary from Paradigm, a company that designs textbooks specific to the ASHP/ACPE Accreditation Standards for Pharmacy Technician Training Programs. The lab at the West Monroe campus is established and the resources will be purchased with the funding from the grant as well as private donations from pharmacies in the community. The room for the lab was currently used for storage purposes only; therefore, making the room functional to the program allows Delta to use space more efficiently for educational purposes.

### BENEFITS TO THE SYSTEM

## Discuss how this change will benefit your students, your community, and the LCTCS.

For years Northeast Louisiana has not been able to offer a pharmacy technician training program accredited by the American Society of Health Pharmacists (ASHP)/Accreditation Council for Pharmacy Education (ACPE), who sets the educational standards for professional pharmacy programs. ASHP represents pharmacists who serve as patient care providers in acute and ambulatory settings. The organization's nearly 50,000 members include pharmacists, student pharmacists, and pharmacy technicians. For more than 75 years, ASHP has been at the forefront of efforts to improve medication use and enhance patient safety. Through the ASHP/ACPE standards, our program will require students to have 120 didactic learning hours, 50 simulated lab hours, 130 clinical practice hours, plus an additional 100 hours divided into the learning modalities provided. Prior to participation of clinical practice, a student must submit documentation that he or she has passed a drug and alcohol test, passed a criminal background check, and received a Louisiana Pharmacy Technician Candidate Registration. The only Louisiana Board of Pharmacy-approved site for pharmacy technician training in West Monroe, LA is Unitech Training Academy, who is not accredited by ASHP/ACPE; therefore, the students are not held to a higher standard, and it is reported that only 49% of their students complete their program, leaving those students without a job and in debt. Their program costs \$15,175 for tuition plus an additional \$225 for books and supplies, leaving the typical graduate with \$10,348 in debt. Unitech Training Academy does not require students to pass a background check or a drug screen prior to entering the program; thus, some students will pay for training and cannot obtain a technician license due to prior criminal activity. Pharmacy technicians are required to handle medications directly and should be trusted to do so. The need for this change has been consistently vocalized to Delta Community College's Campus Director, Nathan Hall, by numerous pharmacy managers from pharmacies owned and operated by Brookshires, CVS, and others. Delta responded to the community's need by applying for a \$150,000 grant that will be used to start the new program. Once this grant was secured, Hall reached out to the University of Louisiana at Monroe's College of Pharmacy to hire an interim program director. A new graduate from the ULM COP Doctoral Program, Jordan Walker, accepted the position. She noticed a substantial need for better education and training for pharmacy technician during her 1 year of advanced clinical practice experience and 3 years as a pharmacy intern where she worked side by side with technicians. According to the ASHP/ACPE standards, the program must form an Advisory Committee. The responsibilities of this committee include meeting at least twice a year, determining the curriculum makes possible the attainment of all educational goals and objectives listed in the standard, approving experiential training sites, validating admission criteria, and validating criteria for successful completion of the program. The committee consists of faculty, pharmacy technicians, and pharmacists from appropriate groups, including Carol Aron, President of the Louisiana Board of Pharmacy, Dean Glenn Anderson of the University of Louisiana at Monroe College of Pharmacy, Robert Cloud, manager of Glenwood Regional Medical Center and member of the Louisiana Board of Pharmacy, as well as other appropriate LDCC faculty. Aron, owner and operator of Aron's Pharmacy, made the suggestion for Delta to adopt Bossier Parish Community College's (BPCC) Pharmacy Technician Training Program Curriculum based on the exceptional technicians that graduate from there. BPCC has provided us with information to facilitate this curriculum adoption such as master syllabi for the new courses offered plus a list of laboratory supplies and a tour of their lab at their facility.
