- F. REPORTS
 - 1. Chair of the Board Report

Acting Chair Price provides the following report:

- Welcomed the newly sworn in Board member, Rhoman Hardy, to the Board. Mr. Hardy was sworn in by Leo Hamilton and Monty Sullivan on June 2, 2020. Mr. Hardy stated that he was "happy to join the Board of Supervisors and looks forward to working to advance the LCTCS agenda."
- Thanked former Student Board members Samantha Rushlow and Shanco Williams for their time on their Board over the last year.
- Welcomed newly elected, student Board members, Tara Mitchell and Joshua Turner. He noted that they have not been sworn in at the time of the meeting. They will be sworn in prior to the next meeting. He read the bios below:

TARA MITCHELL

Ms. Mitchell is a student enrolled at Baton Rouge Community College and majoring in business administration with a concentration in entrepreneurship. She is a native of Baton Rouge, Louisiana. She was elected BRCC SGA President in 2019 and was recently reelected to serve a second term leading her college. Prior to being the SGA president, she served two years in the BRCC SGA Senate. Ms. Mitchell is the vice president of the Baton Rouge Community College Rotaract Club. She is a 2020 graduate of the inaugural class of the Leadership Development Academy. She served as the head chef at the Gregory inside of the Watermark Hotel before choosing to pursue an Associates of Applied Sciences Degree. Ms. Mitchell is a 2017 graduate of the BRCC Culinary Arts Program, and did so with a 4.0 GPA, resulting in Chancellor's Honors and a designation as first in her class. She plans on founding a non-profit centered towards rebuilding her community, mentorship, and leadership development. She also hopes to pursue a career in politics or community leadership.

Ms. Mitchell will serve as the community college representative on the Board for the 2020-2021 term. She will also serve as the LCTCS representative to the Board of Regents.

JOSHUA TURNER

Mr. Turner is the Executive SGA President at Central Louisiana Technical Community College, where he leads and coordinates an elected body of his CLTCC campus presidents. A resident of Pollock, Louisiana, he is a second level practical nursing student at the CLTCC Rod Brady campus.

He held many jobs in life prior to enrolling at CLTCC. During his journey to CLTCC, he served as a general manager at a fast food restaurant. He also managed both a small business and accounts with over 300 customers. Mr. Turner credits his last role as a class A CDL driver as one that pushed him into the direction his life is headed now. Over the last five or so years, he recognized that working with a customer-oriented mind set and in a role that allows him to help people is where he wants to be.

He plans on using his LPN license to help people achieve a higher level of health while simultaneously paying for an advanced nursing degree or an MD. He would like to use the communication and leadership skills that he gets from his SGA experience to spur his path to achieving a position in state or federal government in the future.

He is an avid reader who enjoys learning and having logical civil debates about social, economic, and educational issues.

Mr. Turner will serve as the technical college representative on the Board for the 2020-2021 term.

After reading the bios, each were invited to provide remarks.

Ms. Mitchell stated that she is honored to represent Baton Rouge Community College and other community colleges from all over the state. She looks forward to working with the Board in the future. Mr. Turner is grateful for this opportunity and hopes he can do his best to represent higher education and learn something along the way.

2. President's Report

Dr. Sullivan provided the following report:

- He thanked the Board for their support and engagement during this current pandemic and its impact on LCTCS operations.
- COVID-19 Update: Classes were transitioned to virtual and the semester was able to be completed. Colleges have been able to complete health care and other essential occupation degrees and certifications to put graduates in the workforce.

Classrooms are being cleaned thoroughly. Students who were unable to complete the spring semester for any reason have been transferred without penalty to the summer or fall semesters.

The impact of COVID-19 across the state has been tremendous, though varied by community. Urged the Board to continue to lead their respective industries and communities in smart and safe practice.

The 2020 Louisiana Legislative session ended June 1st without a budget. A Special Session began immediately and is slated to end on June 30th with the possibility to end early. The discussions focused on the federal CARES act and how it will be used in the state budget. There is a proposed significant cut in the budget for the LCTCS. Additionally, the legislature continues to consider oil and gas prices, influx in gaming and tourism in the state – all which directly impact the state budget.

In the regular session, House Resolution 52 passed and requests that the Board of Supervisors of Community and Technical Colleges and Board of Regents study and report relative to changes needed for community and technical colleges in response to COVID-19. A report will be presented to the Board later.

LCTCS will continue to focus on its mission to educate and train Louisiana's workforce which will help to strengthen the economy. There is a proposal termed "Reboot Louisiana" – which will use onetime federal funds invested in workforce training certifications at LCTCS Colleges. The return on investment for these completers will positively impact Louisiana's economy.

LCTCS is aware of the social unrest across the nation. LCTCS issued a statement that the System and its colleges will be a place of dialogue, civility, and one that will move forward with positive progress. Announced that the Dean of Humanities at South Louisiana Community College, Dr. Wright, passed away this week. He asked that the Board keep Dr. Wright, his family, and college community in their prayers.

Sara Kleinpeter noted that Supervisors Tim Hardy and Stephen Toups arrived for the meeting and did not participate in the passing of the amended agenda but will participate in motions for the remainder of the meeting.

Chair Price invited former student Board member, Samantha Rushlow, to address the Board. Supervisor Rushlow congratulated the newly elected student members Tara Mitchell and Joshua Turner. She thanked the Board stating that she is "eternally grateful for having the opportunity to serve with you the past year" noting that they always made it a point to listen to her goals and always gave her important feedback on her goals. She appreciates their dedicated work for LCTCS, and for the impact they made on her personally.

Dr. Sullivan invited SOWELA Chancellor Neil Aspinwall and Dr. René Cintrón to present the Board Development Item on the Agenda.

SOWELA Chancellor Neil Aspinwall and LCTCS Chief Education and Training Officer René Cintrón provided an informational report to the Board highlighting the ways that LCTCS college leaders plan to make it simpler for students to enroll in and succeed at their colleges, and to advance LCTCS colleges now and beyond the pandemic including the implementation of a digitally inclusive environment that involves a balanced focus on (1) enhancing course delivery mechanisms and (2) tackling the digital divide in our communities.
