Background: The Board of Regents Support Fund is funded through the interest earnings from a Trust Fund dedicated in the Louisiana State Constitution. Each year, funds are allocated to endow program chairs, professorships and scholarships. Colleges are responsible for contributing private funds that matched with public funds according to Board of Regents policies. One of the policy requirements is approval of the endowments by the respective management board prior to submission to the Board of Regents.

History of Prior Actions: There is a history of approving the establishment of endowments at LCTCS colleges to comply with Board of Regents match requirements.

Fiscal Impact: The Endowments are the result of \$900,000 in private donations. If the matches are approved by the Board of Regents, these endowments will secure an additional \$800,000 in state funding, for a total increase in net assets of \$1,700,000.

Benefits to System: This will help our colleges takes steps towards increasing their foundation assets.

ENDOWMENT AGREEMENT for the Super 1 Foods Endowed Scholarship

ESTABLISHMENT OF THE ENDOWMENT

Brookshire Grocery Company ("Donor") has made agreement to establish an endowed 2year work force development scholarship ("Endowment") for the benefit of the Department Business Technology ("College") at Central Louislana Technical Community College ("CLTCC"). The Foundation acknowledges the Donation with profound gratitude and appreciation.

The Donation is intended to qualify for state matching funds under the Board of Regents Support Fund 2 year workforce development Subprogram or any comparable matching program providing student support, to assist the College in recruiting, retaining and graduating excellent professional degree candidates and by providing eligible students with scholarship support and funding for academic opportunities, However, the Endowment may be used for its intended purposes irrespective of match. Donor is not a party to the Foundation's matching funds requests, and the Foundation's application for or receipt of any matching funds is not a condition to Brookshire Grocery Company's donation.

Recipients of the Scholarship must be full-time students enrolled CLTCC with plan to major in Louisiana STEM transfer curriculum or accounting and finance. Financial need should be a high consideration in selection. Student should maintain a minimum 2.5 GPA. The Vice Chancellor of Academic Affairs in consultation with the CLTCC Foundation, shall determine the number and amount of awards, based on available spendable funds and the needs. Any conditions or obligations imposed on CLTCC in the performance of this agreement must be accepted by the LCTCS Board of Supervisors or its designee in accordance with CLTCC policies and procedures.

Recipients may retain the Scholarship for an additional year(s), provided funds are available and the recipient continues to meet the above eligibility requirements. The Scholarship shall terminate when the recipient receives the pursued degree, or if the recipient fails to remain enrolled full-time (other than in the graduating semester), in good standing and making satisfactory academic progress, or if the recipient is placed on disciplinary probation after one full academic year.

INVESTMENT AND SPENDING POLICY

The Endowment will be managed and invested in accordance with the Uniform Prudent Management of Institutional Funds Act (La.R.S.9:2337.1, et seq.) and applicable Board of Regents policy. Once funds are received by the Foundation, the Donation is deemed irrevocable and the Foundation may combine the Endowment with other endowment funds for investment purposes, to produce the best benefit to CLTCC, maximize expected return, improve diversification and provide management efficiency.

The Foundation will make disbursements from the Endowment in accordance with the terms of this Agreement, subject to applicable law and policies of the Foundation, CLTCC and the Board of Regents. An Endowment spending allocation will be determined annually by the Board of Directors of the Foundation ("Board") in accordance with its Spending Policy, with the objective of preserving the purchasing power of the Endowment. The CLTCC Foundation will annually authorize the appropriation for expenditure or accumulation of such Endowment funds as it determines are prudent for the purposes and permanent duration for which the Endowment is established and may include the

appropriation for expenditure of corpus at levels deemed prudent by the Board, to the extent permitted by Board of Regents policy.

FEES

The CLTCC Foundation serves as management agent for CLTCC Foundation and will assess a reasonable annual Service Fee (1.5%) upon the Endowment to cover Foundation administrative and development costs, comparable to fees charged by institutions managing similar funds and in accordance with Foundation policies.

ENSURING PERPETUAL IMPACT

The Endowment is intended to exist in perpetuity. Should expenditure of the Endowment earnings in accordance with the terms of this Agreement become impossible, impractical or wasteful, in the opinion of the Foundation President/CEO, in consultation with the CLTCC Chancellor, LCTCS System President and considering Donor's original intent, the Foundation President/CEO shall determine an appropriate alternative use for the Endowment. Should the College or Department no longer exist due to an academic realignment, then a similar curriculum or purpose shall take precedence when determining an appropriate alternative use for the Endowment.

In the event the Foundation is dissolved, trust authority for the Endowment may be transferred to a successor foundation. If there is no successor foundation, trust authority will be transferred to the LCTCS Board of Supervisors to be used, as nearly practicable, by the College in accordance with Donor's original intent.

On December 6, 2018, Weeks Marine, Inc. entered into a donation agreement with the Northshore College Enhancement Foundation on behalf of Northshore Technical Community College. In this agreement, Weeks Marine, Inc. donated an irrevocable, charitable contribution of \$250,00 to be designated as an investment in the NTCC Maritime, Electrical, and Welding programs and as part of the Weeks Marine Endowed Scholarship Fund. The purpose of this fund is to provide scholarships to benefit students of the college. At the time of the original agreement, several proposals were discussed on the use of the donations. On January 28, 2020, the agreement was amended as follows:

- \$60,000 was used for the establishment of the Weeks Marine Endowed Professorship in Maritime Transportation. In 2019, NTCC received a \$40,000 match from the Louisiana Board of Regents to establish a \$100,000 corpus. Annual interest earned on the corpus will go toward programmatic support in Maritime Technology.
- \$60,000 was used for the establishment of the Weeks Marine Endowed Professorship in Welding. In 2019, NTCC received a \$40,000 match from the Louisiana Board of Regents to establish a \$100,000 corpus. Annual interest earned on the corpus will go toward programmatic support in Welding.
- A portion of the remaining balance was earmarked for the construction of the Richard Weeks
 Outdoor Classrooms. Any remaining funds from the outdoor classrooms will be dedicated to future scholarships and/or equipment needed for programmatic support in Maritime Technology, Welding, and/or Electrical.

Donor Agreement Northshore Technical Community College

This will acknowledge that a contribution ("Donation") has been made by Weeks Marine, Inc. ("Donor") to Northshore Technical Community College ("College"), to establish the Weeks Marine Construction Pathways Scholarship (Fund").

This instrument sets forth the rules, regulations, and governing provisions that will apply to the Fund which are consistent with the policies of the College.

I. INITIAL GIFT

The Donor has made an irrevocable gift of \$10,000 to the College. This gift is an investment in the Northshore College Enhancement Foundation as part of its NTCC Scholarship Fund.

II. NAME AND PURPOSE

The Fund, designated as Weeks Marine Construction Pathways Scholarship, is hereby created to be administered according to this agreement. The purpose of the Fund is to create annual scholarships to benefit the students of the College.

III. DISTRIBUTION OF FUNDS

The College will be responsible for the fiscal reporting requirements.

IV. ADDITIONAL GIFTS

Any person (whether an individual, corporation, trust, estate, or any other organization or entity) may make a gift to the College for the purpose of the Fund by making conveyance or money to the College designation that the assets conveyed shall be added to this Fund. The form of the gift and any conditions associated with the gift must be acceptable to the College. Any assets conveyed in this manner shall be added to the principal of the Fund.

V. INVESTMENT AND SPENDING POLICY

- A. The Fund shall be permanently managed by the College. The tax benefits available to a donor for gifts to the College are determined by the appropriate sections of the Internal Revenue Code.
- B. The Donation is irrevocable and the Fund will be administered in accordance with the College's investment guidelines and spending policies. The undersigned Donor(s) agrees to permit these funds to be merged with other assets of the College for investment purposes provided that the assets are separately identified and accounted for periodically.
- C. The scholarship awards are on an annual basis. The award will be made based on the amount of funds held by the college in the Weeks Marine Construction Pathways Scholarship fund at the time of each award cycle. Should additional contributions be made, the scholarship award could increase with authority from the donor. Should there be no funds available, the scholarship would not be recognized that year.
- D. The scholarship will be annually distributed in support of Northshore Technical Community College based on criteria of the scholarship set by the Donor and in accordance with the process of Northshore Technical Community College.



VI. CONTINGENCY PROVISION

In the event that the funds of this endowment cannot be used or expended according to how the account has been designated or if the stated purpose of the Fund can no longer be met, the party who originally established the Fund may designate another use of the Fund (which must be a similar qualified charitable purpose). If the party who originally established the Fund no longer exists or cannot be located after a reasonable search, then the Northshore College Enhancement Foundation, on behalf of the College, will consider the Donor(s)' original intent and determine how the Fund shall be used. The Northshore College Enhancement Foundation, on behalf of the College, will have final authority to decide upon the use of the Fund in these circumstances.

VII. IRREVOCABILITY

The gift to create this Fund and all subsequent gifts to the Fund (including any subsequent gifts by third parties) are irrevocable.

VIII. **GOVERNING LAW**

This Agreement shall be governed by and constructed according to the law of the State of Louisiana.

IX. SPECIAL SITUATIONS OR ISSUES.

Any situation or issue not covered by this Agreement shall be referred to the Foundation for Louisiana's Community and Technical Colleges Board of Directors, on behalf of the College, for determination and to resolve the matter or issue based upon the Donor's original charitable and benevolent purpose(s) in establishing this Fund.

X. COUNTERPARTS

This Agreement may be executed in multiple counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, and all of such counterparts shall constitute but one instrument. One of the executed original counterparts shall be retained by the Donor, and one of the executed original counterparts shall be retained by the College.

XI. GENERAL

Periodic reports on the financial status of the Fund will be made by the College to the Donor. Reports are to be sent to the following address: Weeks Marine, Inc.; 4 Commerce Dr.; Cranford NJ 07016
