In accordance with R.S. 38:2212.1, the demolition of these buildings requires the approval of Facility Planning and Control and notification of the appropriate legislators. The motion carried.

5. Cooperative Endeavor Agreement between the LCTCS on behalf of Louisiana Delta Community College and Union Growth and Development Foundation

Hardy, seconded by Supervisor Price, the Board voted to amend a prior board action and authorize the President and the Chancellor of Louisiana Delta Community College to negotiate and execute a Cooperative Endeavor Agreement with the Union Growth and Development Foundation to use property located at 300 Anthony Street, Farmerville LA for educational purposes. FINANCE 6. Rescind Avoyelles Campus Realignment

Based on the recent Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS) application status of Central Louisiana Technical Community College (CLTCC) and the good standing of South Louisiana Community College (SLCC), on motion by Supervisor Murphy, seconded by Supervisor McConduit, the Board voted to partially rescind its action taken at the April 2021 meeting and direct that the Avoyelles Campus remain with Central Louisiana Technical Community College. The motion carried.

Supervisor T. Hardy presented the Personnel Action Item for consideration by the Committee.

On motion by Supervisor Smith, seconded by Supervisor McConduit, the Committee voted to enter into Executive Session to discuss Item G.7 Appointment of Interim Chancellor at River Parishes Community College. The motion carried.

1. Appointment of Interim Chancellor at River Parishes Community College

Dr. Sullivan thanked Dr. Jim Carlson for taking the chance at leading RPCC more than ten months ago. The Committee presented Dr. Carlson with the resolution that follows.

WHEREAS, Dr. Jim Carlson has served as Interim Chancellor of River Parishes Community College since the Fall of 2020; and

WHEREAS, Jim's interim appointment lasted longer than originally planned, he gave unselfishly of himself for nearly two years and provided strong leadership during a difficult time in the college's history; and

WHEREAS, Jim has been a champion for the mission of Northshore Technical Community College, River Parishes Community College, and the Louisiana Community and Technical College System and all levels of education in Louisiana for many years; and

WHEREAS, Jim has helped bring stability and a renewed focus on student achievement and faculty and staff development at River Parishes Community College; and

WHEREAS, it is altogether fitting that the Louisiana Community and Technical College System recognize those individuals who have made contributions to this system of higher education; now

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the LCTCS System Board of Supervisors expresses its appreciation for the contributions made by Dr. Jim Carlson during his service as Interim Chancellor at River Parishes Community College.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution be entered permanently into the minutes of the Louisiana Community and Technical College System Board of Supervisors Executive Committee Meeting Records.

Signed on this **Eleventh day of May, Two-Thousand Twenty-Two** by Paul Price, Jr., Chairman, Louisiana Community and Technical College System Board of Supervisors and Dr. Monty Sullivan, President, Louisiana Community and Technical College System.

Dr. Carlson thanked Dr. Sullivan and the Committee for giving him the opportunity to lead RPCC. He enjoyed his time at RPCC but looks forward to returning to his role at Northshore Technical Community College.

On motion by Supervisor Mount, seconded by Supervisor Murphy, the Committee voted to appoint Mr. Quintin Taylor as interim chancellor of Rover Parishes Community College (RPCC), effective June 1, 2022, until such time a permanent chancellor assumes the position. The appointment will provide an annual base salary of \$186,257, a housing allowance of \$25,000, a vehicle allowance of \$7,500 or the use of a state vehicle, and a civic organization allowance of \$2,500 for a total compensation package of \$221,257. The motion carried.

Mr. Taylor addressed the Committee and thanked them for their belief in his leadership and the opportunity to lead at RPCC.

SUBJECT: Capital Outlay Requests for FY 2023-2024

FOR BOARD ACTION

Recommendation: Staff recommends that the Board approve the 2023-2024 Capital Outlay list of recommended projects and authorize the System President to make any technical corrections to the request that may be necessary prior to the final submission to the Board of Regents.

Background: This list reflects the capital construction needs of each of the LCTCS member colleges. The FY 2023-2024 LCTCS Capital Outlay recommended projects are prioritized in groups as follows:

- **Emergency Projects** are defined as projects that are essential to correct conditions that seem to be hazardous to the safety of life or property or to satisfy state or federally mandated codes.
- **Continuing projects** are projects that have received previous funding or are in progress and require additional funding for continuation or completion.
- **New Projects** are those projects that have not been introduced for funding consideration or have been submitted but have not received any funding.

This list does not include the complete list of deferred maintenance needs of the colleges and does not include all projects that have a construction cost of less than \$500,000. Some of the deferred maintenance needs are reflected in the \$20,000,000 system-wide request for Waterproofing and Reroofing project that is the number one emergency project for this system. The LCTCS staff maintains a prioritized list of roofing projects needed at our member colleges. Many of the construction projects valued less than \$500,000 at the various campuses are included in the \$17,500,000 Small Capital Project for LCTCS found in the New Projects category. These two projects have been recurring projects in the LCTCS list of capital outlay needs since 1999. Board staff submitted a Preliminary list of Capital Outlay Projects to the Board for review during the June 2022 meeting. Several changes were made to the final list that have been submitted to the Board for action. Some of the changes are listed below:

- System and college priority order was updated to reflect priorities for several projects.
- The amounts were changed for several projects due to the recent market increases in construction costs.
- Several projects were removed or collapsed to streamline the list of projects.
- Legislative appropriations that were funded by the Bond Commission that were not reflected in the preliminary list submitted for review in June were factored.

Fiscal Impact: The attached capital outlay request includes projects valued at \$503.7 million for planning, acquisitions, construction, equipment, and renovations at the various LCTCS campuses over the next five years.

History of Prior Actions: The LCTCS Board of Supervisors submits an annual Capital Outlay Request to the Board of Regents.

Benefits to the System: The capital outlay request process provides an opportunity to request funding to construct new facilities, make additions, renovate, refurbish, restore and enhance the facilities of the LCTCS.

SUBJECT: Disposal of the SOWELA Technical Community College former Jennings Site

FOR BOARD ACTION

Recommendation: Staff recommends that the Board authorize the President and the Chancellor of SOWELA Technical Community College to negotiate and execute all documents necessary to dispose of the former Jennings site, through sale, lease, transfer or trade for another property. Lease or conveyance documents for this potential disposal must be filed with the local Clerk of Court and the State Land Office.

Background: In 2016, Facility Planning and Control constructed a new campus in Jennings for SOWELA Technical Community College using Capital Outlay funds. Upon its completion, the college occupied the new campus and the former campus is used for storage and as a maintenance/repair shop. The college was leasing this property to Christ Bridge Academy, a local nonprofit organization.

During the June 2020 meeting of the LCTCS Board of Supervisors, the Board authorized the transfer of the property to the City of Jennings through a cooperative endeavor agreement. The City of Jennings opted not to accept the property because of the cost associated with removing the hazardous materials found in this facility, which was constructed in 1947. During the June 2021 meeting, the Board of Supervisors authorized a lease to Christ Bridge Academy with the possibility of sale. Because of funding issues, the Christ Bridge Academy is no longer in a position to purchase the facility and there is concern that the lease costs may no longer be funded.

Other parties have expressed an interest in leasing the property with the potential to purchase. College and Board staff will explore all options and proceed with the disposal/ option that provides the most benefit to the LCTCS. Both staffs will perform all due diligence as we proceed with the disposal of this site.

Fiscal Impact: Negotiations for the sale of the property are ongoing with a prospective buyer. Note that any final negotiated price should not be below the appraised value.

History of Prior Actions: The LCTCS Board of Supervisors approved the transfer of this property to the City of Jennings during the June 2020 meeting and during the June 2021 meeting authorized a lease to Christ Bridge Academy.

Benefits to the System: The lease, sale or transfer of this of this property will offset the operating costs of the college in the near term and potentially eliminate all costs once the property is sold.

Recommendation: Staff recommends that the Board authorize the System President and the Chancellor of SOWELA Technical Community College to complete all requirements and execute all documents necessary to use the Act 959 process to fund the replacement of the heating ventilation and air conditioning system (HVAC) in the Charleston Building at the Lake Charles campus. Approvals from the Board of Regents, Facility Planning and Control, and the Joint Legislative Committee on the Budget are required for this process.

Background: Act 959 (La. R.S. 39:128) of 2003 permits certain capital projects to be performed by an institution without going through the traditional capital outlay process. Construction and renovation projects not exceeding \$5,000,000 from self-generated, auxiliary income, grants, building use fees, and donations are permitted through this process with proper approvals. Local and federal funds can also be used for these projects.

The college proposes to use funds from the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF) to replace the HVAC in the Charleston Building. This building was repaired after sustaining extensive damage during Hurricanes Laura and Delta in 2020. The hurricane repairs included minor funding for HVAC but did not include major repairs or replacement of the 45-year-old HVAC system. The HEERF grant allows the use of these funds to cover the costs of replacement of HVAC systems to improve and increase the air circulation in buildings.

Fiscal Impact: The project's funding includes up to \$2 million in funds from the HEERF grant and an additional \$160,000 from Hurricane Relief/Claims funds.

History of Prior Actions: N/A

Benefits to the System: The replacement of the HVAC System in the Charleston Building will reduce the repair and maintenance costs for the college, and it will improve and increase the air circulation in the building.

Approvals from the Board of Regents, Facility Planning and Control, and the Joint Legislative Committee on the Budget are required for this process.

Background: Act 959 (La. R.S. 39:128) of 2003, permits certain capital projects to be performed by an institution without going through the traditional capital outlay process. Construction and renovation projects not exceeding \$5,000,000 from self-generated, auxiliary income, grants, building use fees, and donations are permitted through this process with proper approvals. Local and federal funds can also be used for these projects.

Fletcher Technical Community College has a Capital Outlay Project to construct a Precision Agriculture Training Facility, which is nearing completion of design. Recently, the college received a private donation commitments, up to \$3 million, to fund enhancements to this training facility on the Schriever Campus. These funds will be used to offer additional training areas in the facility, or, if needed, to fund the current planned construction. If due to the increasing cost of construction the proposed cost of the facility, as designed, exceeds the amount of funds currently available from Capital Outlay, the donated funds will be used to fund the deficit.

Fiscal Impact: Up to \$3 million dollars from private donors have been committed to this project.

History of Prior Actions: N/A

Benefits to the System: The additional funds provided by these donations will assist in funding the construction of a facility to train agriculture specialist in this region of the state.
